Request for public information

Pursuant to Article 61 of the Constitution of the Republic of Poland and to the Act on Access to Public Information, we request the following information:

1. What were the subjects discussed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs Jacek Czaputowicz at the meeting with his Moldovan counterpart, Tudor Ulianoschi, that took place on 6 December 2018 during the 25th OSCE Ministerial Council in Milan? To what extent was the case of Ukrainian citizen Lyudmyla Kozlovska raised (as indicated by media reports), in particular in the area of the alleged funding by the Open Dialogue Foundation of Moldovan opposition politicians? What was the position expressed in this respect by Minister Jacek Czaputowicz? Which documents concerning that case were used by the Minister during the conversation? Did the Moldovan side hand over to the Minister or to other representatives of the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs any documents concerning Lyudmyla Kozlovska and/or the Open Dialogue Foundation and, if so, what were they?
2. To what extent, in the period from August 2018 to 8 February 2019, did the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs cooperate and exchange information with Moldovan structures on the Open Dialogue Foundation and on Lyudmyla Kozlovska, President of the Board of the Foundation? Was the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in contact with the Moldovan Parliament in connection with the work of the special parliamentary committee of inquiry appointed to investigate "the impact of the Open Dialogue Foundation on the internal situation in Moldova" and the Foundation's relations with the democratic opposition in that country? What information and documents were passed on and received from the Moldovan side? Were these documents transmitted to the Polish services (in particular to the Internal Security Agency /ABW) before a decision was taken to include Lyudmyla Kozlovska's data in SIS II? Please provide copies of the above-mentioned documents and indicate the representatives of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs involved in the above activities.
3. Did the Minister of Foreign Affairs and the diplomatic services take a position on the widely disseminated Moldovan media information that the inclusion of the Foundation's activist Lyudmyla Kozlovska in the Schengen Information System by the Polish authorities was due to suspicions of her associations with, and even her acting as an agent for the benefit of Russia? What actions did the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs take in order to correct the information published in the Moldovan press concerning the cooperation of Polish services with Moldovan structures in the case of the Open Dialogue Foundation and/or Lyudmyla Kozlovska, to the

detriment of the pro-European opposition groups in Moldova led by Andrei Năstase and Maia Sandu?

4. Did the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland cooperate with public administration bodies in Poland – and, if so, with which ones – in connection with the inclusion of Lyudmyla Kozlovska's data in the SIS II system on 31 July 2018? What were the activities related to the inclusion of the above-mentioned person's data in SIS II and to administrative proceedings concerning the granting of a residence permit for a long-term resident of the EU, file no. WSC-II-F.6153.339.2018 (which ended with the Mazowieckie Voivode's refusal on 4 October 2018), involving the participation of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs?

5. What is the official position of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Poland in relation to the European Parliament resolution 2018/2783(RSP)¹ of 5 July 2018 on the situation in Moldova, the annulment of the election of the Mayor of Chisinau on 29 June 2018, which was unfavourable to the ruling party, and the state of respect of civil rights and the rule of law in this country in 2016–2019? How was it expressed?

6. Please indicate the full list of meetings of representatives of the Polish government administration with state structures (including diplomatic services) of Moldova and the topics discussed during them in the period from 1 March 2018 to 14 February 2019.
